Scenario:

Arthit, a university student, buys an iced latte from Coffee Shop D'Oro, located on the MUIC campus. The latte costs 80 THB, which Arthit pays in cash. After receiving his drink, Arthit takes the cup to a table to begin studying on his laptop. While placing the cup on the table, the poorly sealed lid pops off, spilling coffee onto Arthit's laptop. The liquid seeps into the device, causing it to malfunction and rendering it unusable. Arthit approaches the cashier to request compensation, but the cashier refuses. Frustrated, Arthit then files a complaint with MUIC.

- 1. Analyze the legal issues arising from this case. Identify the main actors, the sources of any obligations that may arise under Thai law, and the potential damages that can be claimed under each ground.
- 2. Evaluate the most appropriate form of business organization for Coffee Shop D'Oro to operate on the university campus. Provide your reasoning.
- 3. Coffee Shop D'Oro uses a distinctive, but unregistered, logo on its cups to promote its brand. Analyze the legal issues related to the use of an unregistered logo under Thai law.

Scenario:

Napat, a university student, is hurrying to the 4th floor of MUIC before his exam. As he walks past a recently mopped section of the hallway, he slips and falls, injuring his wrist. The area had no warning signs indicating the wet floor. Later, Napat learns that the hallway was cleaned by a university maid. Frustrated and unable to attend his exam due to his injury, Napat files a complaint with MUIC.

- 1. Analyze the legal issues arising from this case. Identify the main actors, the sources of any obligations that may arise under Thai law, and the potential remedies Napat may claim under each ground.
- 2. Suppose you are setting up a business that provides cleaning staff to universities in Bangkok. Evaluate the most appropriate form of business organization for this venture and explain your reasoning.
- 3. To prevent such incidents in the future, your business develops a new method for cleaning floors that significantly reduces time and improves safety. Would this method be classified for legal protection under Thai law as a process or a product?
